

Samuel M. Klugh

Samuel M. Klugh, aged 54 years, a resident of Butler for the past twelve years, died at 7:35 this morning at his residence, 815 East Jefferson street. He was born in the Chicora district, Butler county, and had resided there until he came to Butler to make his home. He was a member of the Second United Presbyterian church of Butler and of Camp No. 63, W. O. W., of Chicora, and of the United Mine Workers of America.

Mr. Klugh had been employed in the mines in the Butler district for twelve years and sustained a broken back in an accident about eight months ago. The injury was the indirect cause of his death, it is said.

Besides his widow, Elizabeth Klugh, he leaves a son, Dewey Klugh of Butler, two sisters, Mrs. J. Y. Snyder of Vandergrift and Mrs. Ernest Sanderson of Cleveland, O., and one brother, James Klugh of Karns City.
