

Raymond E. Klugh, 66, Legion District 27 Commander, Dies

Raymond Ellwood Klugh, 66, of 1348 Orr Ave., Kittanning, 27th District Commander of the American Legion, died suddenly Saturday in the Armstrong County Memorial Hospital, Kittanning, of natural causes.

A U.S. Army Air Corps veteran of World War II, Mr. Klugh was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of Kittanning, and the American Legion of Worthington.

He was a member of the First Methodist Church, and Hose Company No. 6, Kittanning.

He was a constable of the Fourth Ward, Kittanning. A truck driver until he was disabled, he had driven ambulances and trucks for Penn-DOT.

Born July 15, 1921, in Worthington, he was the son of Lonnie and Florence Bell Beck Klugh.

Surviving are his wife, Virginia Hough Klugh; two sons, Fred R.
