 member of said organization. I further swear that said John Lehigh

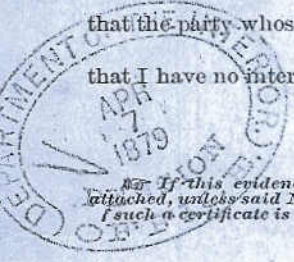
contracted the following disability, while in said service, viz: and while in the line of his  
duty while in camp at Harpers Ferry Virginia some time in  
January or February 1863. He contracted a disease  
which the surgeon pronounced jaundice. I was with

all that time he was sick with the jaundice and  
for about a month he lost his voice and could only  
speak in a whisper
