L, 14th Regiment of Penn Cav Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 23rd day of Oct, 1862, at Pittsburg, in Co. L, 14th Regiment of Penn Cav Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. L, of that Regiment, for the months of from enrollment to Feb 28th, 1863, he is reported present for duty - Nov² Apr 6³ discharged for disability Apr 18/63 -

Cert. of Disability reports him discharged at Harpers Ferry, Va., April 18th, 1863. The records of this office furnish no evidence of disability Nov 1862 as claimed. D. J.
