I have this day examined the person of John Blough & find his present difficulty to be chronic bronchitis & congestion of the liver. The bronchitis is so bad as to prevent him from doing anything which requires much exertion as the membrane thickens & narrows the calibre of the bronchial tube. He also has night sweats which keep him in a weakened condition. His liver is enlarged, congested & very tender the tenderness extending around the entire right side. He is somewhat jaundiced & in my opinion is incapacitated from performing manual labor to the extent of  $\frac{3}{4}$  of his time. He further states that both of these conditions began while in the army Kittanning, Pa.

I do further declare that he does no interest in said case and am not concerned in its prosecution.
