well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

I am at present afflicted and disabled with

 the same diseases which disabled me prior to my being discharged from the service, in 1864, as set forth in my original application for invalid pension. During a number of years, from about 1868 till about 1875, I was not so much disabled, as I was immediately after my discharge, but for the past ten or twelve years I have been growing worse every year and it appears that as I become older the trouble in the chest and back grow worse and cause me to become helpless. I therefore respectfully ask that my claim for pension be reopened, and that all evidence furnished in relation thereto be reconsidered. My name, usually spelled Clough, I am informed, is Clough on the War Records. I did not know this fact when my first papers were filed, not being able to read.
