Instructions—read carefully.

The witnesses must state:
1st. Their respective names and occupation; the length of time they have known the soldier, and how long during that period they have employed, worked with or for him, lived in the same neighborhood with him and how near to him.
2d. If they have employed or worked with him they should state where it was and at what business; if they know him as neighbors only they should state about what proportion of a sound, able-bodied man's work he is able to do—whether $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, or as the case may be; what his actual earnings are, and whether not the wages paid him less in amount, and how much less on account of his inability to labor, than is paid to others physically sound, and doing the same kind of work.
They should also state whether they are able to say what his disabilities are, and describe fully and early the symptoms as they appear to them in his case; in fact, describe his
