

PHYSICIAN'S AFFIDAVIT.

PROOF OF PHYSICAL DISABILITY.—Act of June 27, 1890.

TAKE NOTICE.—The affidavit should, if possible, be in the handwriting of the affiant; the marginal instructions must be carefully observed before writing out the statement. All the facts in possession of affiant as to the origin and continuance of the disability should be fully set forth, and the dates of treatment should be specifically given.

NOTES.
Physician's affidavit must contain the following facts:
A complete analysis of the disabilities upon which the claim for pension is based, and the peculiar nature of the disease which incapacitates him.
That the soldier is suffering at least from a partial or physical disability of a permanent character as the result of an vicious disease which incapacitates him from performing equal labor in the same degree as to other men of his age and condition, or that he is unable to do so without the aid of a support.
The degree or extent of the disability has been ascertained since the date of his application for pension, and should be specifically stated.

Have known applicant for a couple years during which time I have treated him for trachitis and kidney disease which to my mind disables him for doing any great amount of manual labor. Besides the disease cited he suffers from disease of the eyes. He is a man of 62 yrs of age and not at all well preserved. Seems to be suffering from general disability and in my opinion is worthy of a pension.
